# Despite Alarming Crime Rate, Americans Seem Unconcerned About Home Security

Call it a false sense of security, sixty six percent (66%) of Americans are not concerned about home security despite the fact that nearly two out of five have been burglarized or know someone who has been burglarized in the past two years.

"Burglary can strike anyone," says Dr. Wilbur L. Ryker, director of the National Crime Prevention Institute. "Homeowners must become more cognizant of their vulnerability and take home security more seriously."

This sense of security revealed in the survey may actually end up contributing to crime in the form of homeowner carelessness. In fact, forty percent (40%) of break-ins involve an unlocked door or window. Ironically, some estimates indicate that a third of Americans cite door and window locks as their primary source of home security.

While one group of Americans may not be using their existing security, many others have upgraded their security in the last year by changing locks or adding a deadbolt to entryways.

"Add-on" security products such as patio security bars and door security bars are inexpensive ways to further enhance home security and prevent thieves from entering their home through doors. Patio security bars help prevent intruders from forcing a patio door open and lifting it off its track. Door security bars, which are

wedged between a door knob and the floor to stop forced entry, can be particularly effective in metropolitan areas where break-in rates are two to three times above the national average.

Actually, the chances of a thief having a duplicate key, according to an industry expert, are as great as one in fifty (1 in 50). Many mass merchandisers and home improvement stores sell padlocks that have "common stock codes," for which a very limited number of unique keys are made. In other words, a thief could watch you buy a padlock, purchase several more from the same bin, and potentially wind up with a key identical with yours.

# Question: What are the most common ways thieves try to break into padlocks?

#### Answer: All of the above

Most common lock keys are so easy to copy, even an unskilled thief can copy your key just by writing down the code stamped on most keys. It is worth your while to look for locks featuring security measures to prevent this. Padlocks with pick-proofing features like double locking action cylinders, hardened steel inserts to resist drilling, and lock shackles to resists bolt cutter attacks are also good investments.

Many thieves use automobile dent pullers to rip cylinders out of the padlock body. Look for padlocks that provide resistance as protection against pull attacks and padlocks that use a dual ball bearing locking design that is recommended by the National Crime Prevention Institute. This reduces the chances of shackle pull attacks.
